• Launched in 2011, SJC strives to be a truly collaborative network of partnerships.

- SJC initially focused on three major parts of the Sustainable Jersey certification in community educational outreach, urban sustainability, green building (energy efficiency & carbon sequestration), green infrastructure
- Major program areas are:
 - o Community composting
 - o Sustainable network of community gardens
 - o Greener buildings
 - o Green Infrastructure
 - o +ART
- SJC recently launched new certificate program in green building through the National Sustainable Structures Center
- Worked to distribute bokashi composting buckets to local community gardens
 - Model for community gardens to run this themselves run out of the Peace Garden
 - HHS wanted each community garden to have drop-off points for household food scraps
 - Also interested in doing community outreach workshops
 - April is "growing soil" month!
 - o Now partnering with Community Compost Company to address food waste in NJ
 - Doing a pilot at the Modera Lofts high rise to assist apartment dwellers
 - Can drop off their bucket at St. Paul's for free or can get a residential pick up for a fee to CCC
- Hosting a number of film screenings of "The Soil Solution" in April, during Earth month
- Eat Well Guide for Jersey City Grace org's program that SJC helped advertise
- Green infrastructure
 - o Built 2 rain gardens, 1 moss mural project, and street tree initiatives
- How can the JCEC play a part?
 - o Most opportunity is through educational initiatives
 - o Support a couple composting workshops?
 - Could provide support on social media?
 - Would need to vote as a Commission to put out this type of information each time
