ARTICLE II

LAND USE BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND ADVISORY BOARDS

345-11 ARTIST CERTIFICATION BOARD

A. Establishment of an Artist Certification Board

- 1. There is hereby created an Artists' Certification Board (ACB), which shall serve as a citizens advisory board to the Planning Board, pursuant to N.J.S.A.40:55D-27.a. The ACB shall be in, but not of, the Division of City Planning. The ACB is essentially an artists peer review committee. In order to reside in a work/live studio in the WALDO, an artist must be so certified by the Planning Board. The Planning Board shall be guided in this certification by the recommendation made by the ACB. The Planning Board may reject the recommendation of the ACB, but the reasons for such rejection must be clearly stated in the resolution approved by the Board.
- 2. The ACB shall be comprised of persons knowledgeable in the arts. It shall consist of five (5) full members, with no more than two (2) additional alternate members who may vote in the absence of full members. A minimum of three (3) full members of the ACB shall be professional artists. All members shall be appointed by the Mayor. After the initial appointments are made, all terms shall run for four (4) years.
- The ACB shall review applications filed by persons who are interested in occupying work/live space in the WALDO as either owners, tenants or sub-tenants, to determine if the applicant can be certified to occupy such space.
- 4. The following shall serve as criteria to be used by the ACB in certifying an artist: 1) The artists' commitment to the fine arts as a career; 2) The need for large loft space in which to create his or her art; 3) Education; 4) Current body of work; 5) Exhibition record; 6) References from other artists or art professionals. In no event shall the content of the art created be used as a criterion to determine eligibility to occupy work/live space in the WALDO.
- 5. The recommendation of the ACB to the Planning Board shall be submitted to the Planning Board within thirty (30) days of the ACB's decision, and shall state the reasons for the decision with specific reference to one or more of the criteria set forth in paragraph four 4 (above).

Thanks for the opportunity to supplement my application for Artist Certification. As a combined theater/visual artist my need for a studio space (even a comparatively moderate loft) will provide a more practical environment to create and display larger multi-media and set design model concepts (along with the necessary materials, supplies, and tools), as well as to accommodate the theatrical activities that are a recurring part of my work as a director and teaching-artist.

Even projects and rehearsal/development workshops with only six to eight participants will be easier to facilitate within a larger living/work space. In addition, I'm currently developing original productions that will combine stylized movement, music, and visual projections within a multimedia format.

Regarding a more chronological account of my background history as an artist—I've attached date-formatted resumes documenting my work as an actor and director, which continue to serve as the foundation for all of my associated creative endeavors.

The ENCLOSED DEMO - https://youtu.be/7nZHc12q4NA is the opening sequence for a new musical called – THE SOUL OF ROCK N' ROLL, which was written by and showcased veteran (Las Vegas) singer Kristy Love Brooks; as both a historic tribute to the roots of this music genre, and a celebration of many of its significant icons. Kristy invited me to assist in developing and staging the show's Las Vegas premiere in January 2020 (following her performance within the cast of a history-based play that I had written & directed during a previous guest-artist residency in 2017 – additional info ["Life-Time"] below.)

The show's prologue (choreographed and performed with energetic flare by Cammie Griffin; with music by Felton Pilate, and video production by Dave Future) was conceived to provide an overview of the historic evolution of rock-n-roll. As a **director** [& set designer], this opening represents a satisfying collaborative-orchestration of key talents within the production: the playwright, composer, video editor, dancer, and technicians — in order to engage our audience's curiosity within the show's overture.


Over the course of six classes this summer at Lincoln Park Apartments in Newark, Teaching Artist KENT JACKMAN engaged students ages 5-10 in theatre games and story-building exercises expanding upon the children's own knowledge and experiences.

Kent tapped into aspects of his students' lives to keep them engaged in the material. "This can be particularly useful with personal story-building exercises, and it also facilitates building individual confidence and self-esteem," he says, adding that this method is especially helpful with new groups, shy students, and shorter programs.


He aimed to foster a fun environment where students would enjoy learning. "I incorporated theatre games and exercises that would stimulate imaginative play and collective creativity," he explains. Kent was also mindful of the summer learning gap that occurs when students are away from school over the extended break; to counter that, he says, "I also attempted to provide skills and/or insights that can be carried into their work as the school year begins; specifically, storytelling structure and an increased awareness for the need to focus on a given objective."

This was Kent's second time teaching with ATG. We asked Kent what he believes sets our programs apart; his reply: "I think the answer is implied within the name of the organization. Now more than ever, young people need a safe place to explore their ideas, while learning to cooperate with their peers and with adults. Providing a safe, creative environment for nurturing this kind of personal growth is essential to a child's general well being, and in my experience Arts to Grow has consistently offered this kind of programming—meeting children where they are and working with them in their own communities." Kent tapped into aspects of his students' lives to keep them engaged in the material. "This can be particularly useful with personal story-building exercises, and it also facilitates building individual confidence and self-esteem," he says, adding that this method is especially helpful with new groups, shy students, and shorter programs.


